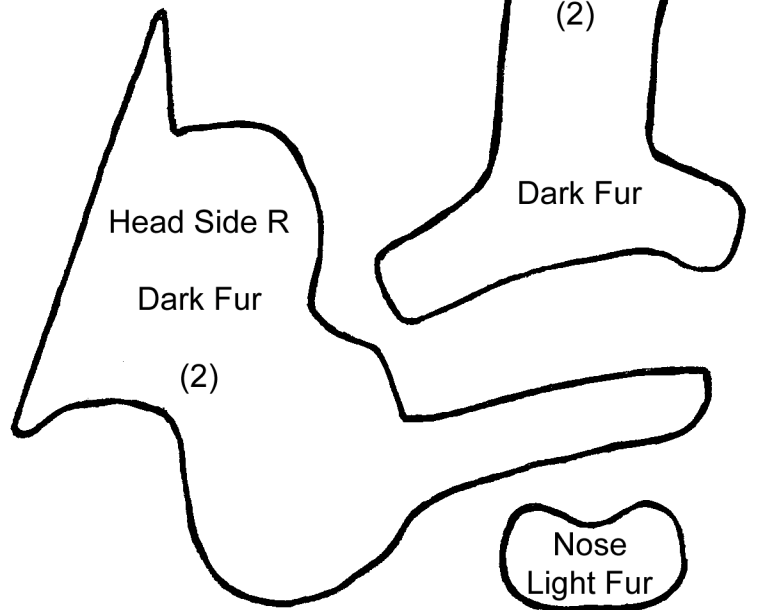
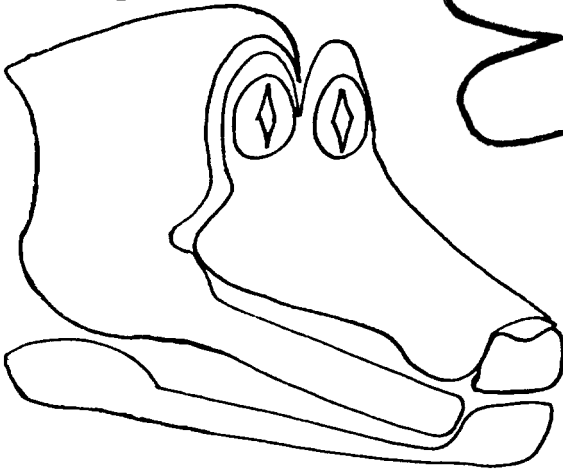
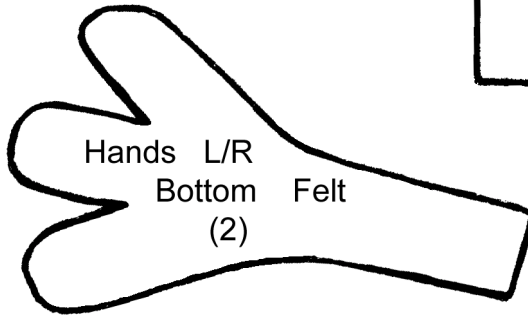
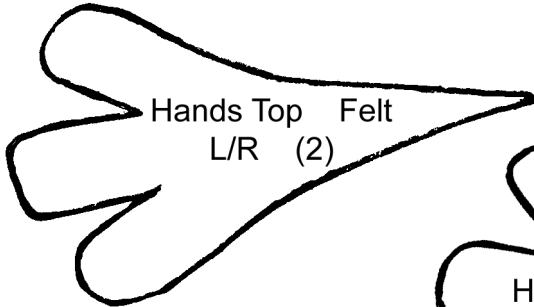
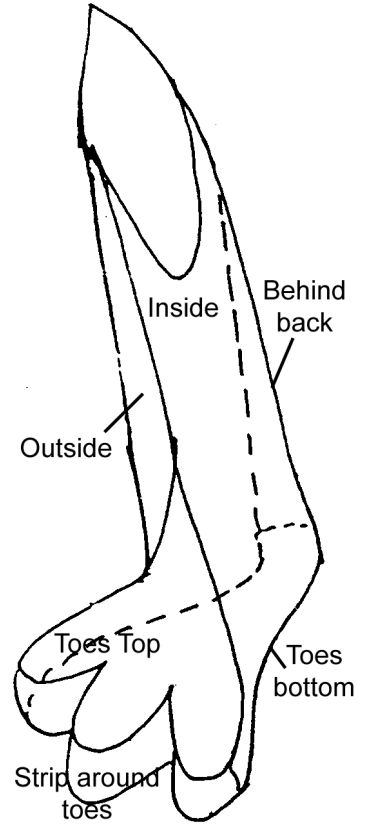
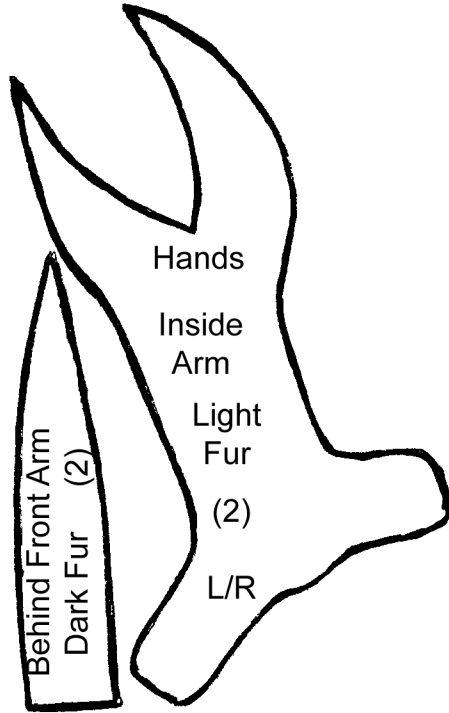
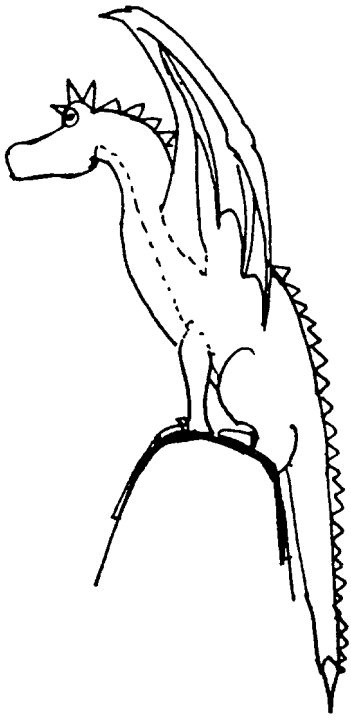
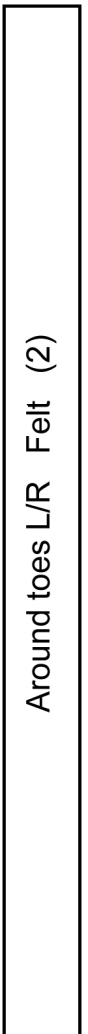
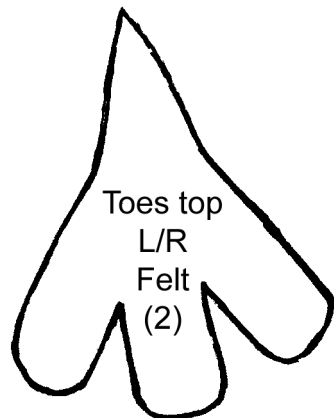
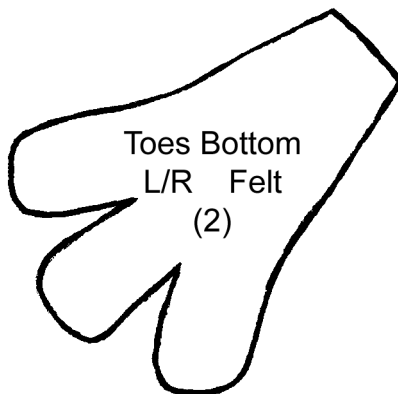
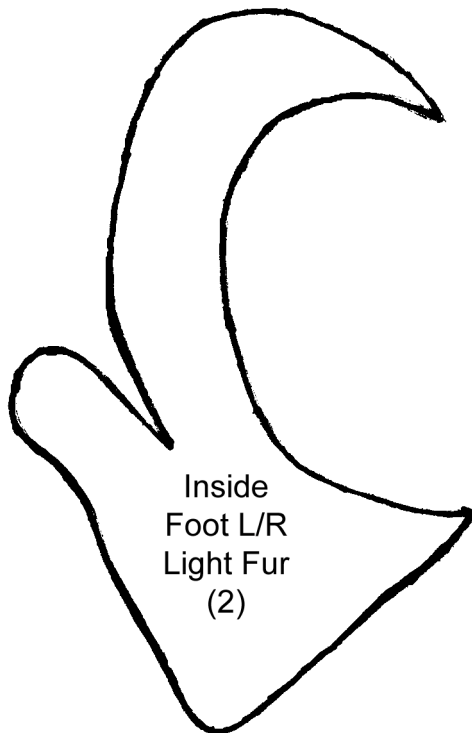
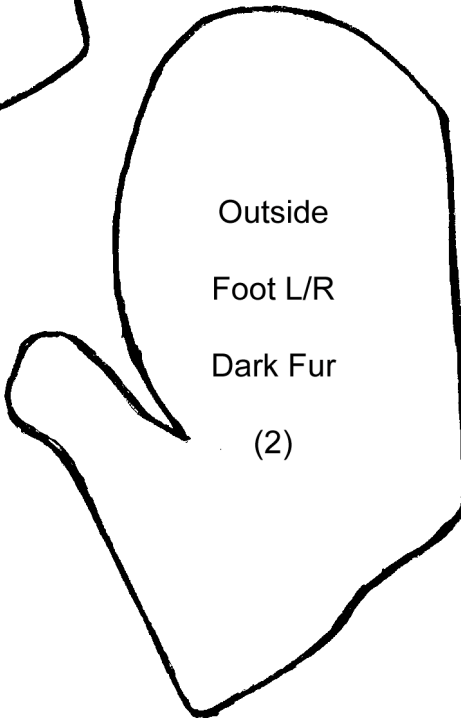
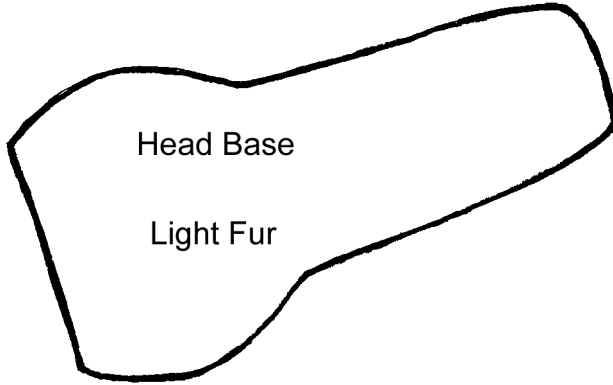
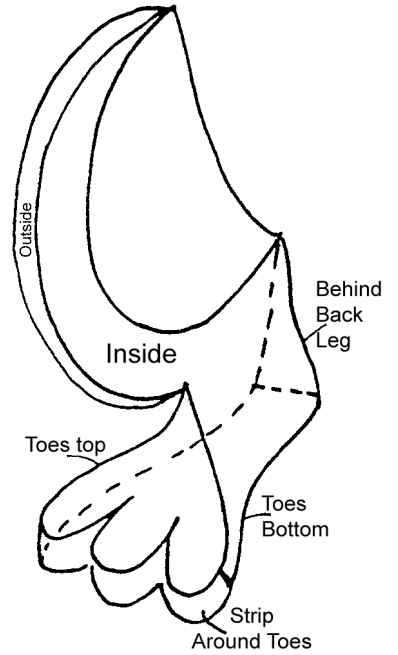
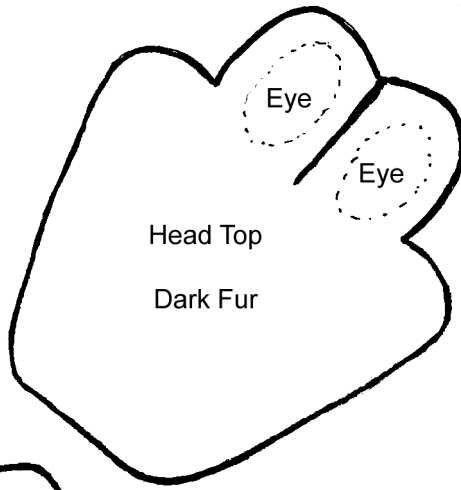


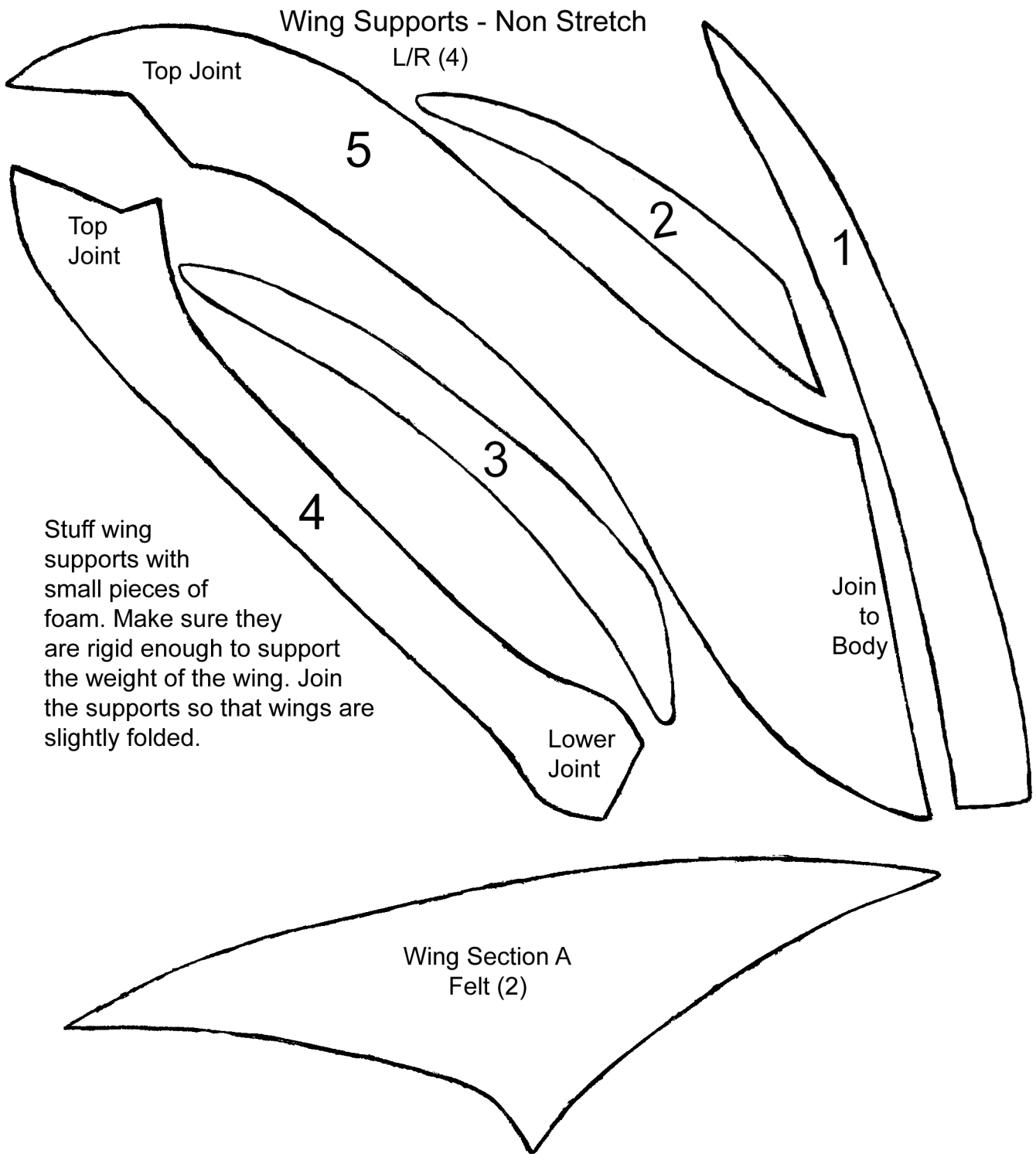
Shoulder Dragon



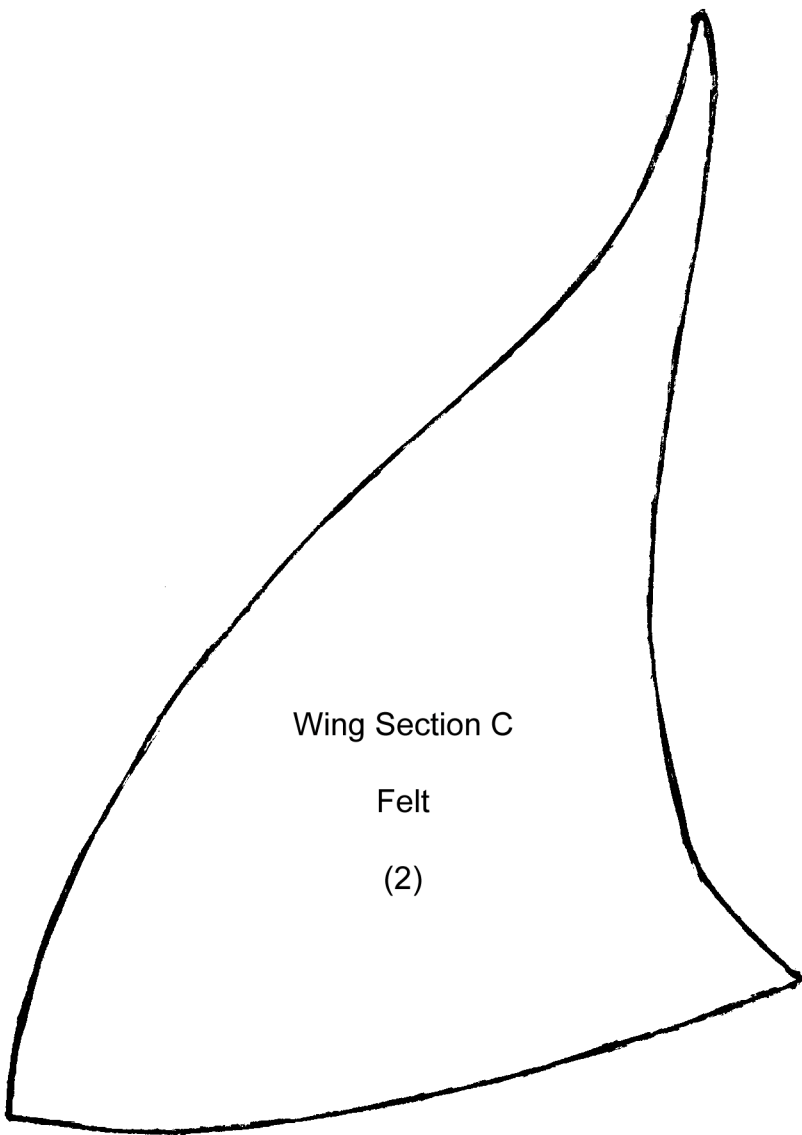
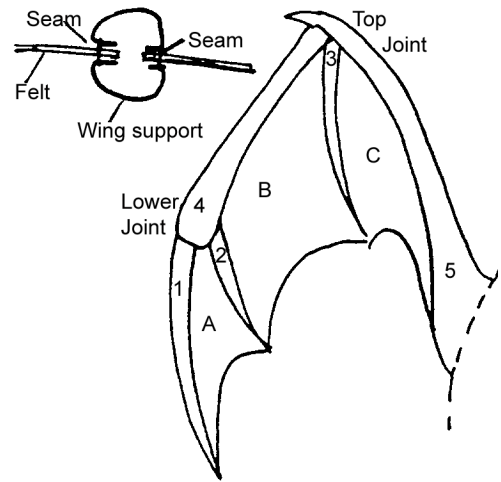
The above diagram shows how to construct the head of the Shoulder Dragon.

Note the construction of the rear foot opposite.





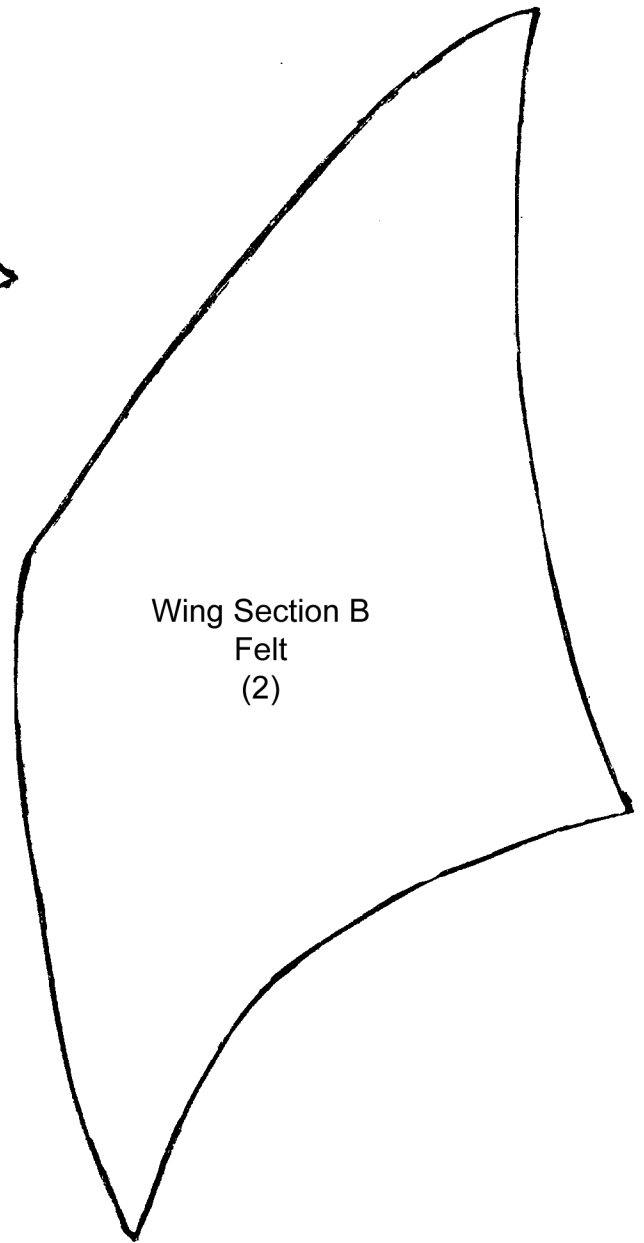
Make sure that the wing supports are made out of non-stretch material and are sewn tightly together. This is so that they can stand a lot of stuffing as well as support the felt wing sections.

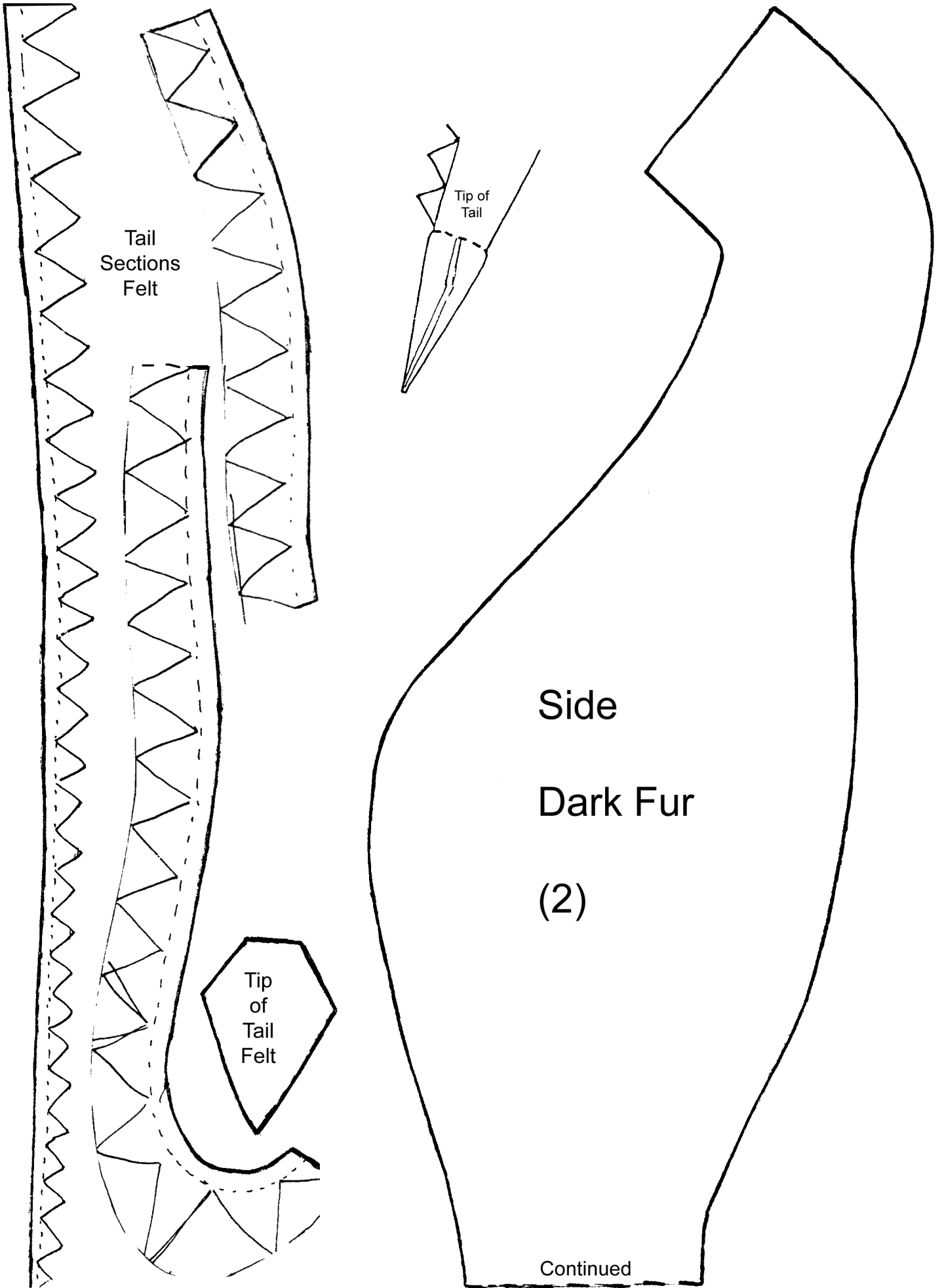

Note the construction of the wings above right. The body of the Shoulder Dragon itself needs to be stuffed fairly tightly to avoid the material being pulled out of shape by the weight of the wings.

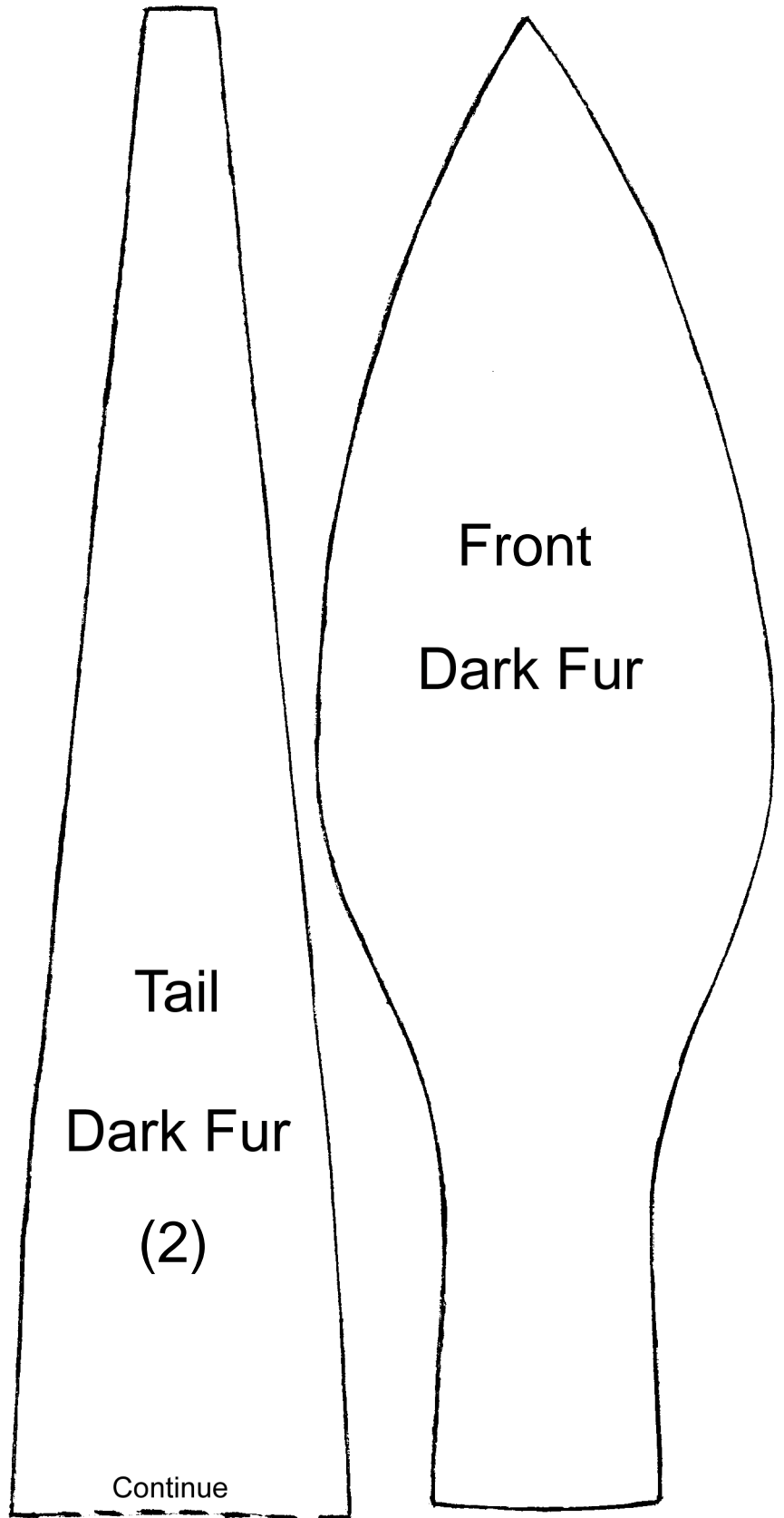
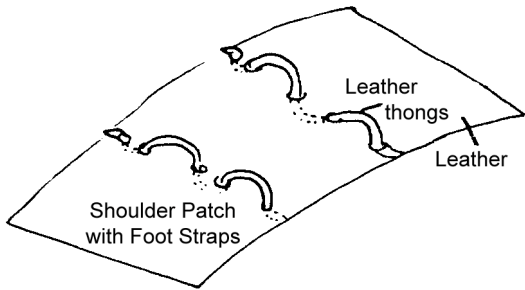
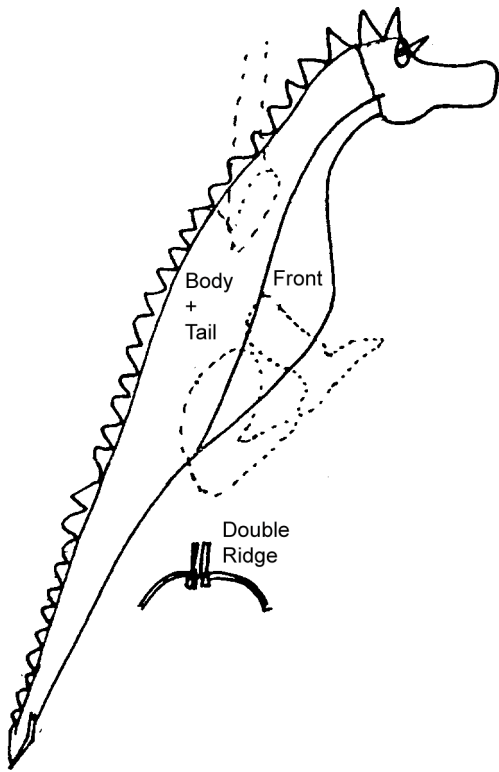
